Last but not least, CELEBRATION, the real DNA of this summer event that its host regions, Cherbourg-en-Cotentin, the Cotentin, Manche and Normandy Region on the one hand and La Trinité-sur-Mer, Auray Quiberon Terre Atlantique council and the Morbihan on the other, are delighted to welcome in a **friendly atmosphere** that attracts great numbers. At each edition, the public's enthusiasm rises, and people flock to the quays of Port Chantereyne and La Trinité-sur-Mer to see the yachts.

True to the spirit of innovation characteristic of the event since its beginnings, Jacques Civilise and his team have designed **three brand new courses**, 600, 1000 and 1500 nautical miles long, and **special trophies** will reward "sport" boats, clubs and boat builders, who are all part of this great celebration of offshore racing. # **Jacques Civilise**

## Passion, determination and innovation

The creator of the DRHEAM-CUP / GRAND PRIX DE FRANCE DE COURSE AU LARGE, Jacques Civilise, has had an unusual personal and professional life. Born in Pointeà-Pitre in 1946, he moved to Paris at the age of 7 with his parents and three brothers and sisters, a "shock and uprooting" for him, who likes to say he was "born with his feet in the water. "He rediscovered the sea in Cherbourg where his uncle, a Naval Officer, lived, and where he spent all his holidays as a child and teenager. "I learnt to swim on the Napoléon beach and at around the age of 16, I discovered sailing at the Cherbourg Sailing School."

It caught on and since his first beats in the Channel, Jacques Civilise has continued sailing and racing, along the coast and offshore. At the end of the 1980s, he moved from Cherbourg to La Trinité-sur-Mer, which became his new home port. It is no coincidence that the second edition of the DRHEAM-CUP / GRAND PRIX DE FRANCE DE COURSE AU LARGE was held between the two harbours so close to his heart.

These formative years shaped the self-taught man, who married and became a father at the age of 21 (common at the time). At the end of the 1960s, he started working for car manufacturer Renault, where he climbed the ladder thanks to his ability to analyse and find solutions. "I was noticed as a "young person with potential", enabling me to follow very comprehensive training courses in the company for several years, in law, finance, management, psychology, international trade, etc... ". An unusual career that took Jacques Civilise to the management of the company's innovative programmes, with free reign to bring them to completion. "I managed everything like a sailor in a race: I was given the destination, but was free to choose my crew, the route, strategy in a truly "cooperative" manner.

Committed to human relations in the workplace, he specialised in the field and opened his own Innovation Consultancy practice, where he modelled a management strategy known as DRHEAM (Development of Human Relations and Management Applications), that he put to use with Renault first, and then other prestigious clients such as Bouygues Immobilier, Rhodia, Orange/ France Télécom, Michelin, DCNS as well as car racing with Formula 1 and sailing, with "Le Défi", the French Challenger project during the 2003/2004 America Cup.

After retiring from this varied career as "innovation captain", Jacques Civilise had not had enough and decided to create the race of his dreams, the well-named DRHEAM-CUP, which he has continued to develop with passion and determination.

# 2016: A happy first!

The second edition of the DREAM-CUP, the DRHEAM CUP-Destination Cotentin, was held from 19 to 28 July 2018, with two courses, 736 and 428 nautical miles, and a new port of arrival, Cherbourg-en-Cotentin. From 40 entries in 2016, the numbers grew to 76 boats that left La Trinité-sur-Mer on 23 July, including 55 of the 123 future participants in the 2018 Route du Rhum-Destination Guadeloupe, for which the DRHEAM-CUP was a qualification race.

The first boat to cross the finish line on the 428 Mile course was Charlie Capelle's Multi 2000 Acapella-Soreal-Proludic. "This victory is a nice new line on Acapella's hulls, and was written thanks to a crew of remarkable young people, who in my opinion, are future greats", explained Charlie Capelle. Multi 50 Solidaire en Peloton-ARSEP skipper Thibaut Vauchel-Camus, came first on the 736-mile course, winning his first race on the boat. "It's really gratifying, the game was very open, there

was Figaro-like atmosphere, trying to gain small advantages, managing ridges, playing with currents and tides" explained the delighted winner.

In IMOCA, a British woman claimed victory, Sam Davies (Initiatives Cœur), just ahead of the Franco-German skipper Isabelle Joschke (Monin), a real symbol in a race that made women's participation a priority. "I'm very proud, it's the first race that I have won solo in Imoca, I stayed ahead most of the race, and I won the prologue, I couldn't have dreamed better! ",

In Class 40, announcing his future victory in the Route du Rhum, Yoann Richomme (Veedol) was first on a brand-new Lombard design launched barely a month earlier, which explains why he said: "I am the first person to be surprised by this victory, as it was the boat's fifth sail only. I learned a lot."

# **2020:** A breath of fresh air!

The first multi-class race organised in France after the lockdown, La DRHEAM-CUP / GRAND PRIX DE FRANCE DE COURSE AU LARGE 2020 attracted 95 crews that were delighted to experience the outstanding atmosphere of such an event again, despite the situation that made organising a race village impossible: "We can only thank the organiser and the city of Cherbourg-en-Cotentin for giving us the opportunity to see our racing friends again and enjoy pre-race stress with all the safety checks and analysis of weather files. It is great to see each other on the pontoons, we are finally going to race, which is what our boats are designed for", explained Thibaut Vauchel-Camus (Solitaires en Peloton-ARSEP) the day before

In this third edition, to group arrivals in La Trinité-sur-Mer as much as possible, Jacques Civilise innovated again and came up with three courses, DRHEAM-CUP 400, DRHEAM-CUP 700 and the DRHEAM-CUP 1100 designed for the Ultimes, with a mix of coastal and offshore sailing that is the salt of these major multi-class races. Although weather conditions led the new Race Manager Hervé GAUTIER reducing the last two courses (550 Miles and 750 Miles), the DRHEAM-CUP / GRAND

PRIX DE FRANCE DE COURSE AU LARGE was an opportunity for very close racing in all series, which finally rewarded talent and diversity.

The first over the line in La Trinité-sur-Mer was **Maxi Edmond** de Rothschild, raced by the duo Franck Cammas/Charles Caudrelier, who added a victory in the DRHEAM-CUP/GRAND PRIX DE FRANCE DE COURSE AU LARGE to their name for the first time, after a little under two days at sea (18.64 knots average speed). In Multi50, Solidaires en Peloton-ARSEP won a second time, as did Charlie Capelle in Multi 2000 on Acapella Proludic, winning in corrected time. The real time victory in that class came to the 100% disabled crew of **Team** Vent Debout (Fabrice Payen). As for the monohulls, a fierce battle was fought in the Figaro Bénéteau 3 class, which was taking part in the race for the first time, finally won with panache by British sailor Sam Goodchild (Leyton), as well as in Class40 - a victory for **Crédit Mutuel** (lan Lipinski). In the IRC class, **Expresso** (Guy Claeys/Luce Molinier) won in the double handed race and Lann Aël 2 (Didier Gaudoux) in the crewed class.

## **2022:** A colourful edition

Growing numbers of participants, racing at all levels, three demanding courses and varied weather... All the ingredients of this fourth edition of the DRHEAM CUP / GRAND PRIX DE FRANCE DE COURSE AU LARGE came together, making this competition rival the greatest, as well as serving as qualification of the Route du Rhum-Destination Guadeloupe. "Success depends on several factors: first, event staff that works with passion! Also, partners' and sailors' loyalty. It is a great satisfaction to see their trust in us when they return time after time. We have also managed to attract new competitors, with increasing numbers of international competitors" explains Jacques Civilise.

In addition to the numbers present, the level was exceptional. "In all categories, the competition was fantastic" he adds. The sailors say it best: Sam Goodchild, the great winner in the Ocean Fifty class, recounted the intensity of the race as he arrived in La Trinité-Sur-Mer:

"What a race with Seb (Rogues), and Erwan (Le Roux)! we each had our little moment ahead, but fortunately I was there at the end. What is certain is that I didn't drop the ball. I am

proud of myself and what I achieved. Even during a Figaro leg, I have never been so far... I have never slept so little."

In Class40, the largest category with 34 participants on the starting line, we had to wait the last few miles of the race to discover the podium. Absolute suspense!

Catherine Chabaud, winner of this edition in Rhum Mono on Formatives Network describes the beauty of the race, as she arrived with red eyes in the middle of the night: "It is a privilege to be able to take part in this superb race. I think this race and this boat brings Jean-Marie and me good luck!" Beautiful stories are unfolding in the DREAM CUP.

The enthusiasm of participants is transmitted to the host ports: "The growth of the event would be impossible without the support of the Chantereyne and La Trinité-sur-Mer ports, who, in high tourist season, reorganise their marinas to welcome increasing numbers of competitors. Their enthusiasm for the race and their involvement at our sides is very precious. We also wish to thank the Yacht-Club de Cherbourg, the race's support club and Organising Sporting Authority, an essential connection in the organisation of the race, adds Jacques Civilise.

Launched in 2016 by Jacques Civilise, LA DRHEAM-CUP / GRAND PRIX DE FRANCE DE COURSE AU LARGE has continued to grow, with rising numbers of participants in each edition and a reputation that has now spread beyond the French coast. The fifth edition of the DRHEAM-CUP / GRAND PRIX DE FRANCE DE COURSE AU LARGE will be held from 11 to 21 July will not make an exception to this rule as it has been listed in the French Sailing Federation's calendar since the very start as well as the Racing Division of the Yacht Club de France's calendar.

In 2024, the DRHEAM-CUP / GRAND PRIX DE FRANCE DE COURSE AU LARGE has confirmed its international scope by entering the Royal Ocean Racing Club's annual championship and will be the second leg of the IRC Two-handed European Championship.

Several classes have added the race to their circuits: **CLASS40**, the race is part of the 2024 European Championship, the **MULTI 2000** as well as the **Figaro 3 Bénéteau** class have all listed the race in their calendars.

LA DRHEAM-CUP / GRAND PRIX DE FRANCE DE COURSE AU LARGE 2024 will also be a major meet for the first season of the new **SUN FAST 30 One Design**, with a separate ranking for them.

A great international fleet is expected on the starting line in Cherbourg-en-Cotentin and obviously very worthy winners at the finish in La Trinité-sur-Mer.

# A word from the Race Manager, Hervé Gautier:

It will be my third DRHEAM CUP / GRAND PRIX DE FRANCE DE COURSE AU LARGE as Race Manager.

As a sailor, I love the format of the DRHEAM-CUP / GRAND PRIX DE FRANCE DE COURSE AU LARGE, and have myself taken part in many similar races, such as the Rolex Fastnet Race, the Rolex Middle Sea Race, the Bermuda Race and Caribbean 600. It is both a sprint and a marathon, typically the type of race in which very good amateurs can rival professionals, the mix between offshore racing stars and Corinthian racers is truly the salt of the DRHEAM-CUP / GRAND PRIX DE FRANCE DE COURSE AU LARGE.

Like in 2022, the 2024 race will include three courses: the shortest will be 600 nautical miles, equivalent to a

long leg of the Solitaire du Figaro, the longest will be 1500 nautical miles. Between the Channel, English coast, Irish Sea, the tip of Brittany and Bay of Biscay, skippers will be served a clever mix of coastal sailing - which navigators love as there is plenty of strategy, they will play with current, as well as crew as there is plenty of deckwork - and very open long offshore reaches. This often leads to multiple plot twists until the end, as the previous editions have shown.

In this 2024 vintage, the increasing numbers of twohanded crews and international crews add an extra dimension to this race and broadens the fleet. The competition already promises to be great from the start in Cherbourg-en-Cotentin to the finish in La Trinité-sur-Mer "

### **Courses**

### **The DRHEAM-CUP 600**

**600 nautical miles** (IRC, Sun Fast 30, Figaro 3 Beneteau, Multi 2000, Mini 6.50), from the South of England (Shambles West), the Isles of Scilly, Ushant and Plateau de Rochebonne, before heading to the finish.

### The DRHEAM-CUP 1000

**1000 nautical miles** (Ocean Fifty, Imoca, Class 40, Open Large Monohulls) will head to the Fastnet after the Isles of Scilly, before heading to Ushant and the BXA buoy (Gironde estuary) and Quiberon Bay.

### The DRHEAM-CUP 1500

**1500 nautical miles** (Ultimes) that will take the largest boats to the Isle of Man, then the Fastnet, past Ushant, across the Bay of Biscay to Bilbao and a last run to La Trinitésur-Mer.

# **Sharing and celebration**

## RÊVES DE LARGE, when the sea opens up to young people



When launching the **DRHEAM-CUP** in 2016, Jacques Civilise not only wanted to offer sailors, professionals and amateurs a high-level offshore race, he also wanted to bring together people from different generations and backgrounds to give them an opportunity to share a week-long experience. This explains the **Rêves de Large** initiative, where young people are invited onboard boats competing against each other in the DRHEAM-TROPHY, a twenty-mile prologue race. "Our young people need dreams and adventure and I wanted a race that promoted human relations and sharing between generations", explains the organiser.

The operation was a great success during previous editions, with young people and skippers, who were delighted to share their passion and knowledge, and even inspire future careers.

As Antoine Carpentier, a skipper with an impressive record, has said "It's perfect that organisers have organised regattas like this one to share with children and that children continue to have this passion for Offshore Racing" and as Jonas Gerkens confirms, "I also experienced this. I was once lucky to visit Loïc Peyron's boat when I was 7: it gave me ideas".

In 2016, some twenty children aged 10 to 16, mainly from inland, stepped on board "real racing boats. In 2018, 18 year 6 children from Morbihan schools came to discover racing on 17 boats in the DRHEAM-TROPHY, enabling them to experience the race from the inside with professional sailors such as Erwan Le Roux, Thierry Bouchard and Armel Tripon in the Multi50 class, Fabrice Amedeo and Manu Cousin on Imoca, Yoann Richomme, Louis Duc, Sebastien Marsset and Loïc Féquet in Class40. In 2020, the Covid 19 crisis prevented us from holding the operation, but it was successfully reinstated in 2022, when 24 children aged 10 to 15 from Cherbourg-en-Cotentin were able to turn the winches and hike out with professional offshore sailors in Class40 during the DRHEAM-TROPHY proloque.

As an integral part of the DRHEAM-CUP, the Rêves de Large is of course planned during the fifth edition, during the DRHEAM TROPHY held on 13 July.

To find them on the water, the boats welcoming young people will also fly a yellow "Rêves de Large" flag on their backstay.
